Friends and Neighbors,

The first session of the thirty-fourth Legislature adjourned early yesterday afternoon, one day early!

As expected, the Governor vetoed HB 57: Schools, Communication Devices/Class Size and Funding. The
Legislature met in a joint session to override the veto. The Senate voted 17/yeas to 3/nays and the Housevoted 29/yeas
to 11/nays, for a total veto override of 46/yeas to 14/nays. This solidifies the \$700 increase to the Base Student
Allocation (BSA) to \$6,660 per student. The increase amount is added to the FY26 Operating budget. There is a
possibility that the Governor will line item veto this amount in the budget. If that happens, a veto override will need 45/
yea votes.

A balanced FY26 Operating budget was passed. The FY25 Supplemental, a shortfall of approximately \$250 million, was rolled into the budget. The bill called for the Supplemental shortfall to come out of the Constitutional Budget Reserve (CBR), which requires a vote of 15/Senate and 30/House. The Senate received 17/yea votes and the House received 22/yea votes. Thus, the CBR section fails. The budget contains contingency language that if the CBR failed, a majority of the funds would come from the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) and the remaining from the Higher Education Fund. The balanced FY26 budget has a small buffer of about \$57 million, which will help to cover deficits that result of oil prices fall below \$66/barrel. In addition, the FY26 Capital budget passed.

## Capital Budget - SB 57

On May 16<sup>th</sup> the Senate voted 20y-0n to concur with changes made to the capital budget in the house of representatives. Some notable items in the capital for Senate District S:

Education – 2.73m – Mt. Edgecumbe – replace dorm windows

DEC- Village Safe Water – 21.8m in General Fund to tap into 416m Federal funds for a total of 437.8m

Military & Veterans Affairs – Bethel Armory Barracks 550k

Dept of Revenue – AHFC rural professional housing 11.55m
